GEORGIA AT THE OLYMPICS



The state of Georgia was well-represented at the Tokyo Olympics for Team USA. Class of 2020 inductee Kelley O'Hara (Fayetteville) brought home a Bronze in soccer along with Jane Campbell (Kennesaw) and Emily Sonnett (Marietta). In swimming, Gunnar Bentz (Atlanta) and Brooks Curry (Atlanta) both won Gold with Jay Litherland (Alpharetta) winning Silver. Track and field saw Elija Godwin (Covington) win Bronze in the 4x400 meter relay and Javianne Oliver (Monroe) took the Silver in 4x100 meter relay. Teammates Tyler Austin (Conyers) and Anthony Carter (Decatur) both won Silver in baseball. Allisha Gray (Sandsville) won Gold in 3x3 basketball in the first year the event was held at an Olympic Games. Vincent Hancock (Eatonton) took Gold in skeet shooting for the third year in a row. These athletes did themselves and the state proud at this year's Olympics. Well done!
